



BURNING COAL VEIN

part of the Little Missouri National Grassland

Burning Coal Vein is known for the fire smoldering in the coal layer several feet underground. Although the underground fire is no longer active, the landscape tells the story of the fire that once burned.

DIRECTIONS

Traveling south on Highway 85 (from Belfield):

1. Turn west (right) onto 47th St SW approximately 10 miles south of Belfield and continue for 8 miles
2. Turn west (right) onto Burning Coal Vein Road and continue for 2 miles
3. Turn south (left) onto 3rd Creek Road and continue for 8.5 miles
4. Turn south (left) onto East River Road and continue for 3 miles
5. Turn east (left) at the campground turnoff sign

Traveling north on Highway 85 (from Bowman):

1. Turn west (left) onto County Road X approximately 21 miles north of Bowman continue for 1 mile
2. Turn north (right) onto East River Road and continue for 10 miles
3. Turn east (right) at the campground turnoff sign

OTHER THINGS TO NOTE

- Maah Daah Hey Trail's southernmost trailhead is on the northwest corner of Burning Coal Vein Campground
- Camping is available on a first-come, first serve basis for \$10 a night with access to potable water and handicap accessible vault toilet
